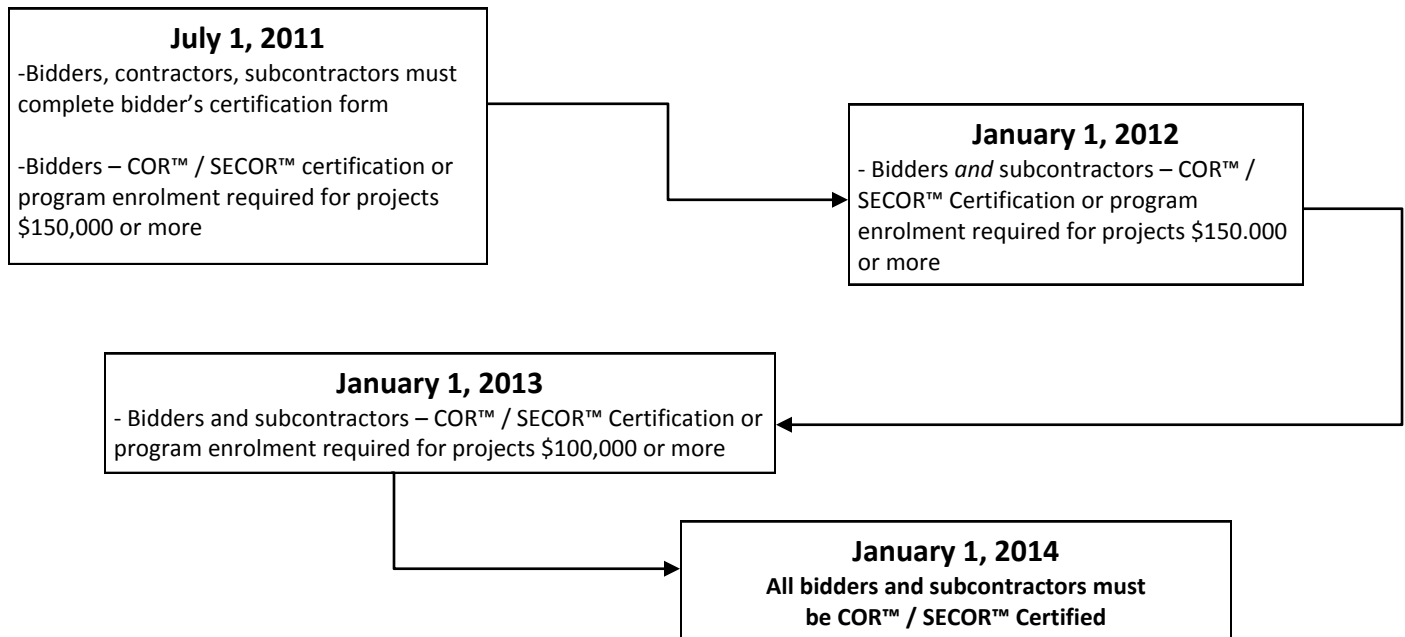


COR™ Certification - The Bottom Line

The Manitoba Government has released information about its new Capital Project Policies. These policies outline new tendering requirements to ensure that contractors and all of their sub-contractors abide by provincial laws laid out in the Workplace Safety and Health Act, the Employment Standards Code, the Construction Industry Wages Act and the Apprenticeship and Certification Act.



The policies also outline new requirements for employing apprentice workers and training Aboriginal people in the necessary trades. To find more information about the Capital Project Policies, visit the website: www.manitoba.ca/tce/capitalprojects.

What does this mean for the construction industry? Contractors and subcontractors will need to obtain COR™ / SECOR™ Certification in order to continue tendering Government projects. All sub-trades hired by COR™ Certified companies will be required to be COR™ or SECOR™ Certified, regardless of the tender amount or who is designated as the Prime Contractor.

The Construction Safety Association of Manitoba is the authority having jurisdiction to grant COR™ and SECOR™ Certification. The CSAM is run by and for the construction industry. Building contractors in Manitoba (also known as the '400 Group') fund the CSAM through a surcharge on a small percent of their assessment premiums collected by the Workers Compensation Board. Companies that do not fall under the '400 Group' can purchase an Associate Membership and be eligible to receive the same training, information and resources, as well as apply for COR™ / SECOR™ Certification.
