Safe Work Procedure:
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 Load the truck with signs and barricades that are required for the site</li> <li>2 Proceed to the job site</li> <li>3 Block off the lane with the Lane Closed or Road closed sign in order to install the proper barricades</li> <li>4 Barricades and signs installed according to signing procedures dictated by the owner or local government</li> <li>5 If no set procedure, the area is barricaded to protect the workers and the public from injury</li> <li>6 When removing the barricades, they are removed in reverse order to allow safety of personnel</li> <li>7 A flag person may be required to assist and egress from the construction site</li> <li>8 The barricades are to be inspected daily by the barricade personnel</li> <li>9 If the barricades are damaged, they are to be repaired or replaced immediately</li> <li>10 On heavy traffic locations, the barricades are to be inspected after the crew has left for the day</li> </ol>

***If an emergency situation occurs while conducting this task, or there is an equipment malfunction, engage the emergency stop and follow the lock out procedure***
