## <u>Hazard Ranking Exercise – Answer Key</u>

For each of the hazards listed below, assign a priority ranking that reflects both the severity and the probability of the injury or damage that could result. Use the National Safety Council categories below and give each hazard both a number and a letter (ie: 3C, 2A).

## For severity:

- 1. Imminent danger (i.e., causing deaths, occupational illness, loss of facilities)
- **2. Serious** (i.e., severe injury, serious illness, property, and equipment damage)
- **3. Minor** (i.e. non-serious injury, illness, or damage)
- **4. Negligible/OK** (i.e. minor injury, requiring first aid or less)
- 5. Not applicable

## For probability:

- A. Probable likely to occur immediately or soon
- **B.** Reasonably probable likely to occur eventually
- **C. Remote** could occur at some point
- **D.** Extremely remote unlikely to occur

## Classify each of the following hazards:

- **3C** A fire extinguisher with an inspection tag past the expiry date.
- **2A** Ice on a sidewalk in front of a busy entry door.
- **1A** An excavation without proper barricades.
- **2A** A worker who is painting without respiratory protection equipment.
- **2A** A worker grinding without a proper safety guard on the grinder.
- **1C** An attendant fuelling a vehicle that is running.
- **2A** Workers removing asbestos without respiratory protection.
- **3C** A WHMIS MSDS book that is missing from its assigned location.
- **2A** An X-ray site without barricades or warning signs.
- **2A** A worker wearing running shoes while loading pipe.
- **2B** A worker not wearing ballistic nylon leggings while operating a chain saw.



- **2A** An operator working in a noisy area without hearing protection.
- **1A** Excessive toxic fume build-up in a welding area.
- **2B** A worker with no eye protection while operating a table saw.
- **2B** A damaged plank on a scaffold.
- **2A** A 15 ft. scaffold without guard rails.
- **2C** A wooden ladder that has been painted with a solid colour.
- **2B** A metal extension ladder with one foot missing.
- **1A** Workers working on a swing stage without safety lines.
- **2B** Workers without hard hats in an area where a hazard to the head exists.
- **1B** An emergency exit blocked by construction materials.
- A major piece of electrical equipment that is undergoing maintenance but is not locked/tagged out.
- **2A** Passengers riding in the bucket of a front-end loader.
- **2B** A signaller giving signals, not wearing proper armbands or reflective vest.
- **2A** Materials being unloaded from a truck by a crane without tag lines being used.
- **1B** Operators using electrical equipment with frayed or damaged electrical cords.
- **1C** An operator running a piece of heavy machinery that has a cracked windshield.
