For each of the hazards listed below, assign a priority ranking that reflects both the severity and the probability of the injury or damage that could result. Use the National Safety Council categories below and give each hazard both a number and a letter (ie: 3C, 2A).

## For severity:

- 1. Imminent danger (i.e., causing deaths, occupational illness, loss of facilities)
- 2. Serious (i.e., severe injury, serious illness, property, and equipment damage)
- 3. Minor (i.e. non-serious injury, illness, or damage)
- 4. Negligible/OK (i.e. minor injury, requiring first aid or less)
- 5. Not applicable

## For probability:

- A. Probable likely to occur immediately or soon
- **B.** Reasonably probable likely to occur eventually
- **C. Remote** could occur at some point
- D. Extremely remote unlikely to occur

## Classify each of the following hazards:

	An emergency exit blocked by construction materials.
	A major piece of electrical equipment that is undergoing maintenance but is not locked/tagged out.
1	Passengers riding in the bucket of a front-end loader.
1	A signaller giving signals, not wearing proper armbands or reflective vest.
1	Materials being unloaded from a truck by a crane without tag lines being used.
1	Operators using electrical equipment with frayed or damaged electrical cords.
<u> </u>	An operator running a piece of heavy machinery that has a cracked windshield.
