40403 ROOFING & EAVESTROUGHING

Roofing and Eavestroughing is the 5th largest of the 18 levied classifications assigned to CSAM. When comparing 2018 to 2019 this industry classification saw an approximate 9% growth in payroll.

This classification is over 70% safety certified and currently resides in the 500% risk category. This speaks to both the high risk of injury and the significance of the injuries sustained. Although Roofing and Eavestroughing has just under 4% of CSAM payroll it is responsible for 8% of the Severe Injuries sustained in the grouping.

In 2019, there were a total of 29 Severe Injuries in the Classification down from 34 the year before. Of the 29, 41% (12) occurred in a work environment that was not safety certified. Given the high risk within this Industry, perhaps we should strive for an even higher percentage of safety certification.

Please refer to the cover page of data which provides some insight into the causes and types of injuries that were sustained in this work environment.
