40102 BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

This classification is the largest of the (18) levied classifications with over a half billion dollars of reported actual payroll in 2020.

The payroll has remained relatively flat when comparing to 2019. This is probably a positive outcome given the pandemic impact in 2020. The payroll in the classification represents almost (31%) of total payroll of the (18) levied classifications and has significant impact on measurable outcomes.

Safety Certification within the classification remains at 53%. Certified employers within the classification received \$954k in premium rebate.

Interestingly, Severe Injuries also remained flat with 119 in both 2019 and 2020, however, there was a significant shift as to the work environment in which they took place. In 2019, (50) Severe Injuries took place in a safety certified environment and (69) occurred in a non-certified environment. In 2020, there was a significant decrease of Severe Injuries in the certified environment (31) and of course a significant increase in the non certified environment.

Please refer to the cover page to identify the top (3) drivers of Severe Injuries. This data is based on the accumulation of a (5) year history of Severe Injury claims.
