40403 ROOFING AND EAVESTROUGHING

In the Roofing and Eavestroughing Classification in 2021 all key indicators remained relatively flat when comparing to 2020. Actual Payroll increased slightly from \$78.4M to \$78.7M. Safety Certification of this payroll remains high at 74%. There are just over 300 registered employers in this classification.

This classification currently resides in the 500% risk category. This speaks to both the high risk of injury and the significance of the injuries sustained. Although Roofing and Eavestroughing represents approximately 3% of the total payroll, they are responsible for over 8% of the Severe Injuries which took place in 2021.

In 2021, there were a total of (30) Severe Injuries in the Classification down from (33) the year before. Of the (30), (18) occurred in a safety certified work environment or 60%. Given the high risk within this Industry, perhaps we should strive for an even higher percentage of safety certification.

We refer you to the cover page of data which provides some insight into the causes and types of injuries that were sustained in this work environment.
