## 70604 WINDOW CLEANING

This classification is extremely small with Actual Payroll of \$1.9M. There are less than 30 employers with the vast majority having payroll of less than <\$750,000 placing them in the category of Small Employer. This is a non-levied classification with approximately 23% of the payroll certified.

The classification had (1) Severe Injury in 2022 and (4) Time Loss Injuries. It currently resides in the highest Risk Category of 800% although has shown positive signs of movement towards the 600% Risk Category.
