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This classification is the largest of the 19 levied classifications assigned to CSAM. Actual payroll increased from \$731M to \$769M or approximately 5%. 55% of this payroll is safety certified.

Severe Injuries dropped from 157 to 148 with the decline taking place in the certified employer population seeing a reduction from 59 Severe Injuries to 52. The vast majority of small employers are not safety certified and were responsible for 87 of the Severe Injuries in 2024.

The classification paid in excess of \$14M in premium in 2024, of which just over \$1M was reimbursed to employers who were safety certified.
