This classification continues to grow reporting actual payroll of \$101M in 2024. Approximately 71% of this payroll is safety certified.

Severe Injuries increased dramatically in 2024 from 19 in 2023 to 26 in 2024. 15 of these injuries took place in a non certified safety environment.

The classification remains in a very high Risk Category 500% however, has recently shown trending in a lower category.
